How can research data from various sources be effectively managed, linked, and reused? On March 18, 2025, at 11:00 am, we will introduce **LinkAhead** – a flexible open-source toolkit for research data management.

LinkAhead automates data integration, seamlessly connects research processes, and works with other RDM tools such as electronic lab notebooks and repositories. We will demonstrate how researchers can efficiently search and link data.
