Learning Objectives Matrix for Research Data Management 3.0 Published

Members of the RDM community have published the third version of the Learning Objectives Matrix for Research Data Management – featuring updated content and extensive supplementary materials such as a glossary and practical application examples. The matrix provides an overview of key topics relevant to RDM and can support the development of curricula or events tailored to specific target groups. The Joint Lab Future Libraries & Research Data (TIB & HsH) was actively involved in the further development of the matrix and will present Version 3 at the 9th Bibliothekskongress 2025 on June 26 in Bremen.
